### Meet the President-Elect: Joyce Sherrer

A true country girl, born in Kansas and raised on a beef and wheat ranch near the Kansas-Oklahoma border, Joyce Sherrer embodies the spirit of resilience and service. Growing up in a two-bedroom home without running water, electricity, or a telephone, she developed a strong work ethic and a passion for education early on.

Joyce began her schooling at Cotton Valley, a two-room schoolhouse, where she graduated as valedictorian and discovered her love for teaching by mentoring younger students—including her sister, who

advanced two grade levels in one year under Joyce's guidance. She continued her academic excellence at Copan High School, again graduating as valedictorian, while participating in cheerleading, student government, sports, and 4-H. Her 4-H leadership and community service earned her a prestigious scholarship from the Pearl M. and Julia J. Harmon Foundation to attend Oklahoma State University.

At OSU, Joyce thrived, participating in Army Blades, being selected Honorary Colonel for ROTC, representing Oklahoma in the National Make It With Wool contest, modeling at the Miss Oklahoma Pageant, and being named a Top Ten finalist for *Miss Teen* magazine. In addition, she was President of Orange and Black Quill, Phi Upsilon Omicron, and Fashion Board. She graduated with a B.S. degree in Home Economics Education and a M.S. degree in Clothing, Textiles, and Merchandising. During her professional years she also received her most prestigious award: An M. D. - Mother on Duty of four children.

Joyce's career began as a Home Economics teacher at Pryor High School before she transitioned to the Cooperative Extension Service, dedicating 25 years as a County Extension Educator in Craig County. She was among the first women appointed as a County Extension Director in Oklahoma. Later, she was promoted to the State Cooperative Extension Service, Joyce served as Director of Staff and Program Development, overseeing the training of new educators, creating mentoring and career advancement programs, and coordinating professional development statewide until her retirement, with over 43 years of service to Oklahoma State University.

Following her Extension career, Joyce returned to the classroom as a science teacher at Coyle School. She and her husband, Gary Sherrer (Past Emeriti President), have traveled extensively, visiting many countries around the world. She has only four U.S. states left on her travel bucket list.

Joyce currently is President of Faithful Extension Workers and serves as a Special Olympics coach and volunteer. Her favorite activities are attending Oklahoma State sporting events, attending OKC Broadway productions, and making floral arrangements.
