### ***Ambulance Services Covered By Medicare***

At the February 20 Making the Most of Retirement meeting, the question was asked about whether transportation by a helicopter ambulance is covered by Medicare. The following is found on Page 31 of the *2019 Medicare & You* handbook:

“Medicare covers ground ambulance transportation when you need to be transported to a hospital, critical access hospital, or skilled nursing facility for medically necessary services, and transportation in any other vehicle could endanger your health. Medicare may pay for emergency ambulance transportation in an airplane or helicopter if you need immediate and rapid ambulance transportation that ground transportation can’t provide.

In some cases, Medicare may pay for limited, medically necessary, non-emergency ambulance transportation if you have a written order from your doctor stating that ambulance transportation is medically necessary. An example may be a medically necessary ambulance transport to a dialysis facility for someone with End-Stage Renal Disease (ESRD).

Medicare will only cover ambulance services to the nearest appropriate medical facility that’s able to give you the care you need.

You pay 20% of the Medicare-approved amount, and the Part B deductible applies.”

*BlueCross BlueShield Supplemental Plan Update:* BlueCross BlueShield has indicated that letters to members regarding the 2019 Medicare Supplemental Plan information and rates will be sent by March 1. Please watch your mail for notification from BCBS. If you do not receive your letter from BCBS, you will need to contact them at 877-258-6781.

When these new rates go into effect and if you have automatic draft set up with the Bursar, please make sure to check that the withdrawal occurs. If your withdrawal does not occur, you will need to contact the Bursar at 405-744-5993 about updating your account withdrawal limit.
